Joeli Armstrong of the U.S. Census Bureau was the guest speaker. In 1737 the census became part of the U.S. Constitution. A census must be taken every 10 years. Some of the purposes are to establish voting districts and the number of seats in the House of

Representatives. In 1790 the first census was taken under the administration of President George Washington. The census also determined how much taxes each state had to contribute to fund the Revolutionary War. Currently the census determines where over \$400 billion goes back to the states for education, etc.

The Census Bureau is currently hiring part-time workers to go to homes and follow up with the people who do not fill out their census cards and return them. It pays \$11.75/hr. and you would work nights and weekends. You will also be reimbursed for mileage at 50 cents a mile. If you would like to apply there is a 30 minute test you have to take at the Butler Library or at the CareerLink office.
